The school comprises of 44 teachers, 7 ECEs, Principal, Vice Principal and 793 students. A 4th portable was added over the summer to to accommodate and was placed to reserve the playground equipment. All playground equipment is paid for by fundraising.

The school openhouse will be helpt on Thursday September 21st. Kaawaate means Shinig waters and was named for it's proximity to the liftlocks.

Kiss and ride pick-up must is at 3pm to accommodate for the bus schedule.

KEPS values student mental health and regulation activities are posted. Additionally, KEPS adheres to the Safe Schools Policy and practices 3 fire drills and 2 mock lockdowns during the school year, a designated police officer also visits the school to familiarize students with his presence.

Announcements are held daily and on Monday's virtual announcements are held in classrooms on a rotational schedule so that students can participate. Edsby is the primary source of communication for parents and summaries and insights are provided through the Patents Peek of the Week.

Letters for Police Record Check are being sent out for school volunteers.

The school is split into three levels; earth, tree and sky and the first Friday of each month is Kaawaate spirit day. Orange Shirt day is September 28th and reflective practices are planned to be delivered in age appropriate ways. Terry fox is this Friday.

Things are under way with the nutrition program, nutrition backs are sent out through the school to families in need of nutritious meal items and a bin of snack food items are accessible in the classrooms when needed. Drinkwear fundraiser was discussed. Proceeds would directly contribute to the playground fund. It will be launched on spiritware with a 2-item rollout for one water bottle and one coffee tumbler. Accessibility options will be discussed if the initial rollout goes well.
