Staffing updates: Ann Marie Sullivan is on a short leave. Laura Manning is in that portable for now. We will be moving to 34 classes for next year; one new portable, and other class? Still working out some options! There are no other spaces in the building. Music Room will likely be used, and the students will still receive music programming.

During April and May, requests are considered from parents for September placements. Kindergarten registration at 69 of a predicted 80. Kindergarten Night is coming up in May.

7:15 pm Regional Council Update Shontelle: We recently had a "thought exchange" via an on line platform. The Parent Involvement Committee recommended a board-wide strategy which has led to our upcoming PA day training. Playground info was shared. We have a School bus driver shortage. Virtual schools are not going to be running in September, so mental health support is being considered for next year's students.

7:25 pm Playground Committee Update- members of the committee Kelly Lewis: Playground Updates:

- We met with Robin, Marguerite, Karen to discuss the playground and the process of making it happen.
- Marguerite had reached out to Jonathan Thorn, who is a KPR Consultant who is willing to come to a council meeting and present the process for the Playgrounds being implemented, once we are closer to the end stages. (Possible Fall?)
- Our subcommittee will look at the following sites for gathering ideas of what we believe would best suit the needs of our student community.

Biernenstocks "Nature's Instrument", "Active Playgrounds" and "Trophic Design"

- Once we have chosen some items, we will contact Jonathan who will connect with the architect and get the "ball rolling"
- Before we can move forward with solid next steps, we have to have a minimum of \$30,000.00 in trust, and closer to beginning stages of development, will have to double that and put approx.. \$60,000.00 in trust.
- Marguerite shared the "Project Based Approach" that POW used to share with families the process for creating playground spaces, using "Phase 1,2,3,4,5" with clear and concise steps in each phase.
- We are investigating sending out a survey to families, students and teachers to enquire what their vision/hopes/dreams are for their outdoor learning and exploring spaces are.
- TD Canada Trust Friends of the Environment Grant: Kelly is looking into the application process.

7:35 pm Any other business: Shared Learning Studios: how they came to be, how's it working

There are intentionally many different learning spaces available, in corners, hallways, breakout rooms. Shared learning studios have a foldable barrier that separates two classrooms, or joins two classrooms. Co-teachers have the entire room (two teachers, 45 kids for example) and they co plan, teach, assess all students. This allows for small-group time. Educators who choose to do that have support from T&L and extra PD/talk time. They have FM systems to help with audio. There is no concrete support about how well this works, but there is support showing that opportunities for a variety of collaborations is beneficial. The teacher really makes the difference.
